

March 24 – 9:30am: PA Rep. Peter Schweyer will visit to discuss the recently adopted recommendations from the Basic Education Funding Commission. Rep. Schweyer is the chairman of the PA House Committee on Education and a member of the BEF Commission. Important changes in how public education in PA will be funded in the future will be discussed. April 7, 11am – Intergenerational Meeting for Worship

April 7, 12:30pm – Showing of *Quakers: the Quiet Revolutionaries.* Quakers: The Quiet Revolutionaries tells the story of a spiritual movement that has played a remarkable role in the religious, social and political life of our nation. Demonstrating an influence disproportionate to their numbers, Quakers have led anti-slavery, civil rights and women's rights movements and been strong advocates for world peace. The program will document the rich history of Quakerism from its founding in 17th century England as the Religious Society of Friends to its spread to America and later to African nations in the 20th century. It will also highlight how Quakerism permeates our daily lives through literature and advertising. Viewers will be astounded when they realize that Quakers have truly played an activist role-on stage but somehow out of the spotlight.

April 14, 9am – Meeting for Business with a Concern for Business

April 21, 9:30am – Discussion on *Poverty by America* by Matthew Desmond, he suggests that a lot of us benefit from poverty by consuming cheap goods, investing in the stock market either directly or indirectly, enjoying tax breaks like mortgage interest deduction and wealth transfer savings, and illustrates how we try to protect those investments. Desmond shows readers how our country does much more to subsidize affluence than to alleviate poverty. He challenges readers to become part of the solution.

We ask that you read the book (a copy is available at the Meetinghouse) and/or listen to an interview with Ezra Klein (link below.) We will discuss the contents of the book then move into brainstorming how we might individually and collectively become "poverty abolitionists."
