Support for Swannanoa Valley Friends Meeting

Greetings Friends,

As were many in our community, we have been devastated by Hurricane Helene. Our beloved Meeting House and property which sits at the confluence of Flat Creek and the Swannanoa River in Black Mountain, NC were heavily flooded and destroyed beyond repair. We were able to salvage a few items, but for the most part we have lost everything. One of our members documented both the destruction and our recovery efforts here: https://youtu. be/f04lHRsxJfU The difficult and emotional decision has been made by our Meeting to demolish the building. We are currently meeting for worship and business on Sunday afternoons in the Black Mountain Presbyterian Church. who had reached out to us to use their building. Several of our members were also directly impacted by the hurricane and have lost their homes and/ or livelihood. We are gratefully accepting contributions to help with the cost of the meeting house demolition, as well as offering financial assistance to members who are in deep need of support. Our next steps beyond this action are still being discerned over the next couple of months: what to do with the cleared property; whether to seek new dwellings in a local church or college; whether to search to buy a building or land on which to build anew. Thank you for holding us in the Light and for your generosity. We are deeply grateful.
